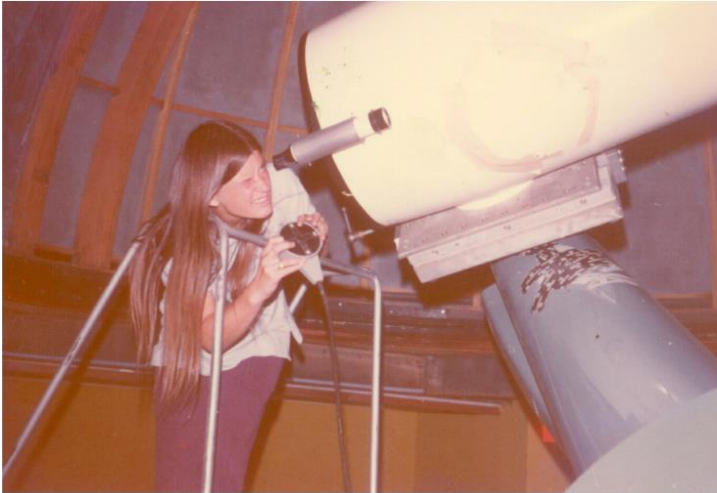
I'm preparing to graduate from the university of North Georgia with a degree in film in digital media. I've written several short films and worked on numerous student productions.

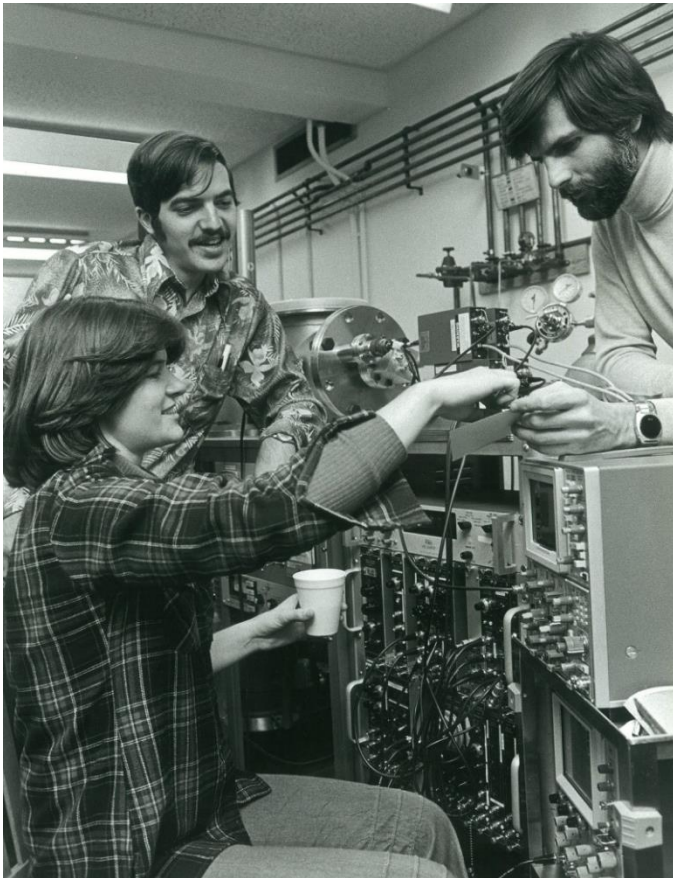

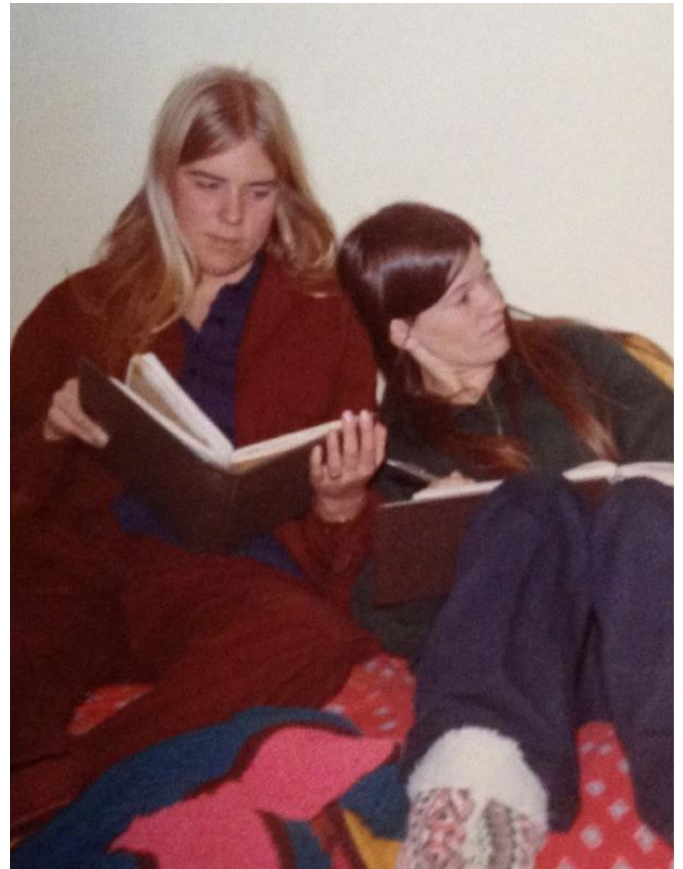
At Stanford, 1970s. As the teaching assistant, Sally had her students help build the mount for the telescope at the Stanford Observatory.
